PARENT & STUDENT-ATHLETE CODE OF CONDUCT

I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.

I (and my guests) will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parents such, taunting, using profane language or gestures and or refusing to shake hands.

I will teach my student-athlete to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.

I will learn the rules of the game and the policies of the tournament, league or event were participating in.

I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex or ability.

I will emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit my student-athlete in the future.

I will promote the emotional and physical well-being of our student-athletes.

I will respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.

I will demand a sports environment for my student-athlete that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and I will refrain from their use at all sports events and lodging areas.

I will refrain from coaching my student-athlete or other players during games and practices, unless I am one of the official coaches of the team.

I will remember that our student-athletes participation is for them, not myself.

I will remember the goals of the competitions are to have fun, improve skills, and feel good about playing. I will not take the competitions or myself too seriously. I will control my emotions.

Game day discussions with coaches:

There are three subject coaches will not discuss with parents during game days.

1. Your student-athletes playing time.
2. Game plans and coaches strategies.
3. Others student-athletes in our program.

Student-athlete conduct lodging site, airports and planes:

All players must be in their room by 11pm, lights out midnight.

All players must respect each other personal items.

No running and playing around in hotel hallways or lobby areas.

All players must be respectful to airline staff and follow all FAA guidelines.
